# INTRODUCTION

## **DEFINITIONS OF THE TERMS**

## Peace

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within a state. (Encarta Dictionary (2007) in Moroby (2004) said peace does not only imply the absence of violence alone, but it encompasses the presence of social, economic and political justice which are useful ingredients for notion of security?, Without peace and security in the family and in the life of every citizenry there can be no security in the society.

## Security

This is seen as a measure taken to prevent attack. It is a method adopted to protect life and property. #### Woman

Maslow's Hierarchy of need, classified safety (security) under physiological, biological need which he said is a primary need of every individual and these needs are hunger, shelter and safety. He opined that safety need include; the need for protection, security and freedom from anxiety and other disturbing emotional state. This then requires that women with adequate knowledge (Education) will be able to create a non hostile home and non threatening environment at home which will guarantee adequate security in the society. Abraham Maslow believes that human beings have certain in born needs which they try to fulfill. To Maslow every need arises from an imbalance of disequilibrium between what human deemed necessary for the health of a person, and what a person's environment provides. He classified human needs in hierarchy and opined that the lower needs are more typically met through responsibility of the family by ensuring security against fear and anxiety. Women being the home maker are directly responsible for the security of their family, so their education will guarantee an opportunity for empowerment and this means she can earn a living with which she can sustain her children's basic needs like food and, cloth and needs.

This means that if women are empowered their children will not go about without food so; they are not likely going to grow into violent citizens. As it is commonly said that a hungry man is an angry man. Education of women will make her acknowledge and appreciate the value of education and this will affect her children's education. ## RECOMMENDATION
